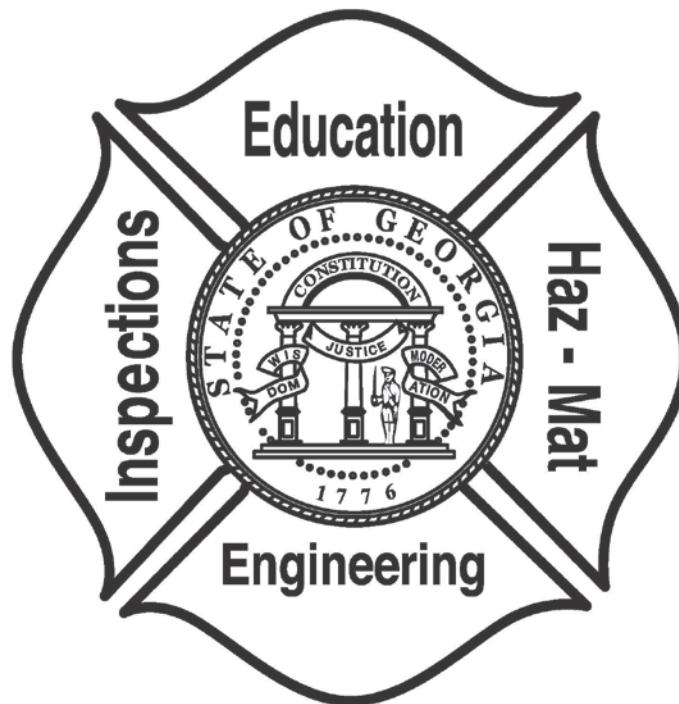

DESCRIPTION OF COURSES

MONDAY JUNE 24, 2019

CRASE-Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events – this course is designed and built on the Avoid, Deny Defend (ADD) strategy developed by ALERRT in 2004. The course provides strategies, guidance and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event.

Food Trucks & Fire Safety - This presentation will discuss the importance of fire safety in regards to food truck. We will talk about things to look for on the food trucks, how to inspect the food trucks, and ensuring that we as fire safety personnel stay ahead of the game.

Hot Topics – Do you want to know what your partners in prevention are doing?! Find out what dynamic programs your neighboring communities are teaching. See six different programs up close.

Setting Up ICS on Special Events – This presentation will show and discuss the importance of using the Incident Command Structure and System while having small-large scale events on campus setting. It will go into detail of how to set up an incident command structure, an incident action plan, the Planning P, and proper staffing for all events. It will also go into detail on conducting a fire watch during large-scale events.

Smoke Alarms – This course will be covering the new UL Standard, reviewing current codes, new products, wireless smoke technology and other smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

Timed Egress Analysis & Smoke Control Design – This course focuses on the code path to a performance based approach. This course will touch on the different types of egress analyses, including people movement software, as well as the challenges of unique atrium spaces and the benefits of smoke control modeling. In addition, requirements for smoke control systems that require special inspections, such as atriums and stair pressurization systems.

Working With Daycares Doing Transports - This session will discuss safety considerations to review with daycares that conduct student transportation including appropriate seat use, seat belt use, and how to present awareness training to daycare staff. This session is open to all students. CPST CEU will be provided.

TUESDAY JUNE 25, 2019

NFPA Updates - The National Fire Protection Association's Public Education Network has numerous free and accessible resources for educators. These materials are featured under the Safety Information section of the home page. We will explore all online materials that are current and continually updated.

Construction Site Fire Safety Train the Trainer – Participants will discuss current model code requirements relating to construction site safety with a specific focus on fire prevention and safety. The code requirements for buildings under construction or demolition are comprehensive and address many different hazards that are common to construction sites and building construction processes.

NFPA Station Tours: How to Get it Right Every Time! – Station Tours and community events are part of every firefighter's job description and in some cases can be a great way to connect to your community. Discover how to ensure everyone has a guide to make every tour meaningful and consistent.

Educational Messaging for the Fire Service and Fire & Life Safety Educators – This session will focus on how to use the latest Educational Messaging document from NFPA to create customized messaging for your community.

The Fire and Life Safety Ecosystem: How You Can Make Our World Safer! - This session will take a look at how we can all help with the many aspects of keeping our world safer. A look at some historic fires, their impact on code changes and how to stay vigilant in a fast paced world.

Piecing Together the Passenger Seating Puzzle – This session will be a review of best practice recommendations when considering seating options for all passengers. Discussion will include 3-across installation considerations, belt path overlap considerations, seating considerations for adult passengers, and more. Session will be interactive and while it is geared for CPSTs, all students are welcome to attend. CPST CEU will be provided.

WEDNESDAY JUNE 26, 2019

Pre-Engineered Kitchen Systems Training – This course has the objective of making attendees more familiar with NFPA 96 and 17A 2018 Edition as it relates to the selection, installation, inspection, maintenance, recharging, and testing of pre-engineered kitchen fire systems. Once the course is completed the attendee will be familiar with this system and their various requirements.

Dealing With the Media – When You Are Not the PIO – This class will teach attendees how to deal with the media even when they are not the Public Information Officer. This course will describe in detail responses and how to conduct yourself on scene during an incident.

Enforcement Officials Fireworks, Pyrotechnics & Special FX Training Program - The American Pyrotechnics Association (APA), is pleased to offer a comprehensive, day-long training session for members of the fire service, regulatory and enforcement communities. Training will include a review of applicable Federal regulations governing the fireworks industry including ATF, DOT, OSHA, CPSC, as well as NFPA industry consensus standards; along with on-going industry efforts to ensure best safety practices. **Note: State & Local laws may also be incorporated into the program.** This training program is a “must” for individuals new to the fire service or enforcement field as well as an excellent continuing education “refresher” course for veteran officials.

Social Media & Public Safety- This course is dedicated to discussing the role of social media within public safety. We will identify social media platforms and learn how to safely use social media. This course will enable the student to create a working knowledge of social media tools and help sheets.

All-Terrain Vehicle ATV Safety-The objective of this ATV Safety presentation is to educate participants about the importance of ATV safety. Professionals who ride ATVs for leisure on public or private lands or who use ATVs on the job will learn the basics of ATV safety education in addition to learning about resources and a network of professionals who are developing Community ATV Safety collaborations and conducting hands-on ATV Safety Institute ATV RiderCourse Programs. Presenter will share their experience in developing community ATV safety partnerships that teach riders to use critical thinking and good decision-making skills while operating ATVs and other Off Highway Vehicles.

CPS APptitude: Using Electronics & Technology Curbside- This session will review using electronic devices when working curbside with parents (smartphones, tablets, etc.). We will discuss various apps that are available and provide useful tips to assist with the curbside education. While this session is designed for CPSTs, non-CPSTs are welcome to attend. CPST CEU will be provided.

THURSDAY JUNE 27, 2019

At-Risk Adult Abuse: What You Need to Know as a First Responder – Elder and disabled adult abuse is often overlooked and under-reported. Abuse happens in the community and in facilities around our state. Attendees will learn to spot the signs of abuse, neglect, and exploitation, how and where to report abuse, and the social service agencies available to

assist first responders. Lastly, the instructors will discuss human trafficking of at-risk adults into unlicensed personal care homes and how to shut down such homes.

NFPA 13, 14, & 20 2016 Edition Update - The seminar will go completely through the standards, and not just identify the new requirements, but discuss the reasons supporting them and the issues behind them as well as their potential impact. Attendees will also be provided with a list of the section locations of significant changes in the standards

Human Behaviour and Fire – The psychological, environmental, and social factors of human actions during emergency events is an important thing for all fields of fire protection to understand. These factors impact human behavior in fire from the time of fire detection all the way until a person enters a safe location away from the fire event. This session will discuss the steps included in quantifying an evacuation and will further discuss different psychological, environmental, and social factors that influence these steps. These factors could have deadly consequences when an occupant delays evacuation and hence is important for all fire protection fields to understand in order to help prevent against.

CPS Top 10: Messages to Refresh on & Some to Let Go - This session will review the Top Ten CPS messages to review and refresh. Think of this like a Letterman Top 10 countdown but about child occupant safety. While this session is designed for CPSTs, non-CPSTs are welcome to attend. CPST CEU will be provided.

Creating Effective Grant Proposals - In this workshop, participants will discuss effective grant proposals, which will include barriers to grant funding, the pre-grant application work that needs to happen, and how to prepare a successfully written grant narrative. Participants will be given examples of various grant applications, and will have the opportunity to network with other participants on finding the perfect match to fund your grant needs.

CPS Hands On Challenge – In this session, Child Passenger Safety Technicians will complete hands-on exercises using common Technician tools, including the LATCH manual, car seat user guides, and the Recall List. Up to 2 CEUs are available for this session. While this session is designed for CPSTs, non-CPSTs are welcome to attend. Two (2) CPST CEUs will be provided for those participating in the full 2-hours.

Close the Door Campaign – Most people don't know the difference a closed door makes in a fire. You can change that. In case of fire, a closed door can isolate the fire's flow, reduce room temperature and keep carbon monoxide levels down. "Close Before You Doze" aims to make closing doors at night part of people's bedtime routine. As a safety influencer, you can help share the benefits of this message as a potential life-saving measure against fast-moving home fires.

FRIDAY JUNE 28, 2019

Water Safety – Think outside the box for community safety! *Each year* thousands of Americans senselessly perish in our waters. This short introduction to community water safety programs will help you gain the knowledge and resources to help keep your community out of the headlines and lowering statistics in your community.

NFPA & Forward Flow Testing – This seminar starts out with a description of the scope and purpose of NFPA 25. It covers the reason for the document, the systems to which it applies, and the basic purpose and goal of the document. It discusses the role of the Owner, the Authority having Jurisdiction and the inspecting contractor. It describes the critical importance of understanding the roles and responsibilities of each of these parties.

PTSD & Suicide Prevention: "Start the Conversation" - This course is designed to provide public safety personnel with information about job induced stress and PTSD. The course also provides information for recognizing the symptoms of stress, PTSD, and suicide. Videos of personal stories from public safety personnel are included to provide information about peer support, CISM, and other resources available for officers dealing with stress, PTSD, thoughts of suicide, and line of duty injuries/death.
